



• **John Doom, of the Eglise Evangelique in Tahiti, French Polynesia.** For many years when being anti-French nuclear testing was not the popular thing to do, Doom stood as a beacon of independence in the Tahiti church. He was opposed to and outspoken about nuclear testing in his islands. His voice has been a major factor in the Pacific Conference of Churches consistent opposition to the nuclear weapons testing programme at Moruroa. Doom is now crusading for all the Pacific — not just Tahiti — from his new perch in Geneva. He is the World Council of Churches Pacific desk officer for the Commission on Inter-Church Aid, Refugees and World Service. By moving outside of the region, Doom has been able to bring more attention to it — particularly in Europe. There he is organising the first joint South Pacific Forum-Pacific Conference of Churches team visit to promote the South Pacific Nuclear Free Zone Treaty.
